## SCORING: 2003 DRYA JUNIOR REGATTAS

1. The 4 DRYA Regattas 5 Regatta days: 3 1-Day Single-host, 1 2-Day DRYA Multi-host. Regatta days from the DRYA event will be scored as separate race days. (Overall prizes from the DRYA event *may* be given.) Results count for a regatta (and for season standings) in each boat type and/or age group after *two* (2) races have been run, completed, and scored for that regatta day. Scores for a completed weather day race will not carry over to a re-sail day. Club prizes *can* be awarded for a single race regatta but results do not count for season points.

2. Single Regatta score for an individual boat. Sum of the boat's scores for all races run, completed, and scored in that boat type and/or age group (RRS appendix A2, A4 Low Point Averaging). Optimist RWB competitors will break out fleet scores from overall position (USODA system). If 5 races or more are run, completed, and scored one discard is allowed. Ties will be broken using RRS appendix A7. Entries that retire without RC notification are scored DNS. (RRS appendix A5 and DRYA Sailing Instructions *Boats retiring*). DNC, DNS, OCS, DNF, DSQ score number of boats plus one. See DRYA Sailing Instructions for DSQs not discardable (RRS 2, 41, 42, 69, 44.1). See DRYA Sailing Instructions for substitution rule.

3. Protests and Redress (RRS Part 5, A, B). Protests will be heard on regatta day by the Chief Judge. Requests for redress will follow RRS 62.1 guidelines. Redress will be determined by the Chief Judge.

4. Season Champion in a specific boat type or age group. Best three of the 5 DRYA regatta days for skipper and/or crew. Optimist RWB competitors use best three combined overall scores. See Sailing Instructions for substitution rule. Season ties will be broken using RRS A8. If there is a tie between results from a single-host regatta and results from the 2-day multi-host the 2-day shall take precedence.

5. Boy's Skipper of the Year. Best three of the five DRYA regatta days with additional mandatory participation in...and points counted from...the DRYA SBS quarter finals. (If SBS races are part of a regular DRYA regatta, SOTY contenders must add a 4th DRYA regatta result.) Eligible boats are *420, Flying Junior, Laser and Laser Radial, Optimist RWB* and/or other boats selected for the SBS. Optimist RWB competitors use overall scores without fleet color breakouts for SOTY. Skippers may compete in more than one boat type and with more than one crew. Ties will be broken using RRS appendix A8 and there will be one award. If there is a tie between results from a single-host regatta and results from the 2-day multi-host the 2-day shall take precedence.

6. Girl's Skipper of the Year. Same criteria as Boy's SOTY. but girls may substitute DRYA Leiter Cup participation for SBS. One award.

7. Crew of the Year. For boys or girls. Criteria is the same as the other *O.T.Y.* awards. One award.

8. Sportsmanship and Shipshape. Determined by the instructors for each boat type and/or age group. The instructors may also select an overall Sportsmanship Trophy winner.

9. River's Championship. A season-end regatta scored separately.

10. Age Determination. 420, FJ, and Lasers use US Sailing rules. (Competitors must turn 9 but not 19 in the calendar year.) Optimists use USODA (United States Optimist Dinghy Association) rules. (Competitors must be 15 or under on Dec 31 of the calendar year. RWB fleet assignments are based on age at DRYA Regatta 1.)
