NOTICE OF RACE posted 2/8/2006

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta shall be governed by the “rules” as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing; the US SAILING Junior Championship Conditions; and the US SAILING Regulations, Section 5.0 Championships.
- 1.2. The Chairman of the U.S. Junior Championship Committee administers the U.S. Junior Triplehanded Championship.
- 1.3. RRS 60.1 (a) is modified to prohibit a boat from protesting another boat for an alleged breach of a class rule requiring class membership.

2. CLASS RULES

- 2.1. The Protest Committee will determine applicable class rules.

3. ALTERATION OF THE RACING RULES

- 3.1. Rules 61.1(a), Protest Requirements and Appendix A2 Scoring Systems are modified for this series, Appendix P, Immediate Penalty for Breaking Rule 42: P2.2 is changed to “second and subsequent protests”; P2.3 is deleted; P3 is changed: “but the protest is counted to determine the number of times she has been protested during the series” is deleted.

4. CLASSES Ultimate 20’s – (Teams of three) Boats will be provided by Bayview Yacht Club.

5. ADVERTISING

The U.S. Junior Triplehanded Championship Finals are classified as Category A in accordance with ISAF Regulation 20.

6. ELIGIBILITY – See Conditions 2.1.

- 9. **HOUSING** – Accommodations will be provided in private homes for the competitors. All competitors must stay in the housing provided.
- 10. **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**- Will be provided at Registration and posted on the US SAILING website.
- 11. **COURSES** – Will be those diagramed in the Championship Sailing Instructions.
- 12. **SCORING** – The Low-Point Scoring System, Appendix A2 of the RRS, as modified in the Conditions for this Championship, will apply.
- 13. **RACING AREA**- The racing area will be the navigable waters of Lake St. Clair and the Detroit River.
- 14. **DECISIONS OF THE PROTEST COMMITTEE** – The right of appeal is not denied at the National Championship.
- 15. **LIFEJACKETS**- All competitors shall wear, while on the water, a U.S. Coast Guard (or Canadian) approved PFD, except for brief periods while changing clothing. The PFD must be worn in conformance with Condition 3.8 B.
- 16. **SPECTATOR BOATS** - Spectator boats will be provided for individuals wishing to view the competitors afloat.
- 17. **COACHING AND/OR SUPPORT OF COMPETITORS**
 - 17.1 Except as specifically provided for in the Conditions, instructors, coaches or other support personnel, and family members shall not go afloat in the racing area at any time during the clinic or racing days, except in spectator boats provided by the regatta organizing authority.



17.2 Except as specifically provided for in the Conditions, competitors shall not receive advice, instruction, or any other type of outside assistance including using electronic communication devices while at the sailing venue until dismissed by the National Coach or Protest Committee during the clinic and racing days.

17.3 A social package for coaches and parents will be available at registration at the regatta venue.

18. PRIZES

18.1. The Sear Cup and the Judges Trophy are perpetual trophies presented to the winner and runner-up (respectively) at the Nationals, and may be retained until 60 days prior to the following year's Championship.

18.2. US SAILING medals will be awarded to the teams finishing in the top three positions.

18.3. Bayview Yacht Club will award shipshape prizes for each member of the team with the greatest number of points for neatness and general shipshape condition of the boats.

18.4. The top United States Team in the Sears Cup will be named to the 2006 U.S. Youth Sailing Team.
