Yachts are requested to monitor VHF radio channel 72 for Course A/B, and channel 68 for Course C from one hour before the warning signal for the first class until finishing.

MANAGEMENT RULES

The race shall be under the management of the Race Committee of Edison Boat Club, which shall have authority to establish the racing conditions and to interpret the racing rules. Except as modified by these sailing instructions, the race shall be governed by the current Racing Rules of Sailing as adopted by the US Sailing Association.

All Skippers are reminded that they must not interfere with freighter traffic at any time and must heed all instructions from the Coast Guard.

Class rules where applicable, determined in advance and made available to the contestants shall apply.

PROTESTS

All protests must be filed with the race committee within 90 minutes of finishing. Protests will be heard at Bayview Yacht Club beginning at 7:30 p.m. on the Monday after the race unless announced differently.

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS – SATURDAY

Flying Scot racing will be held in the general area in front of the Edison Boat Club on Saturday. Race Instructions will be issued and a skippers' meeting will be held at 10:30 a.m. on the EBC lawn. There will be a Spinnaker, Jib & Main, and Novice race.

EBC members who are Flying Scot qualified can reserve an EBC Flying Scot by contacting the EBC office. Signup starts August 16 and ends August 20 at 3:00 pm. Call during normal office hours and tell Debbie which sailboat hull number you want to reserve and which races you will be sailing in.

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS – FRIDAY

The Edison Boat Club is offering two courses on Friday evening for yacht racing. Both are POINT-TO-POINT courses for all classes.

The current Detroit Regional Yacht-racing Association (DRYA) Sailing Instructions shall apply for this Regatta with the amendments included herein.

A/B & C COURSE:

Delete 8, 9, 13 thru 16, and DRYA Course Specific Sailing Instructions. The Warning Signal shall be at 7:00 pm. The Order of Starts will be as specified in this Program. Marks 'D', 'E', 'X', and 'Y' are inflated pyramid buoys. All headings are magnetic and distances in NM's are approximate.

A/B COURSE - INSTRUCTIONS

If the RC boat at the starting line is displaying a RED FLAG OR SHAPE the course shall be from the starting line 2.9NM @ 58° to Mark 'X' (42° 24.5' N, 082° 50.3' W) rounding it to port. Thence 1.6NM @ 321° to Mark 'Y' (42°25.6' N, 082° 51.8' W) rounding it to port then to the finish line leaving the Peche Island Rear Range Light to port.

If the RC boat at the starting line is displaying a GREEN FLAG OR SHAPE the course shall be from the starting line 3.1NM @ 30° to mark 'Y' (42°25.6' N, 082° 51.8' W) rounding it to starboard. Thence 1.6NM @ 141° to Mark 'X' (42° 24.5' N, 082° 50.3' W) rounding it to starboard then to the finish line leaving the Peche Island Rear Range Light to port. The course length for both is 11.2NM.

A/B COURSE - STARTING AREA LOCATION

The starting area will be approximately 300 yards southeast of the Grosse Pointe Club Marina. The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the starting line boat and the water's edge of an orange inflated pyramid.

C COURSE - INSTRUCTIONS

If the RC boat at the starting line is displaying a RED FLAG OR SHAPE the course shall be from the starting line 2.0NM @ 134° to Mark 'D' (42° 20.3' N, 082° 50.1' W) rounding it to port. Thence 2.0NM @ 013° to Mark 'E' (42°22.35' N, 082° 49.8' W) rounding it to port then to the finish line leaving the Peche Island Rear Range Light to port. The course length is 10.1NM

If the RC boat at the starting line is displaying a GREEN FLAG OR SHAPE the course shall be from the starting line 2.0NM @ 073° to mark 'E' (42°22.35' N, 082° 49.8' W) rounding it to starboard. Thence 2.0NM @ 193° to Mark 'D' (42° 20.3' N, 082° 50.1' W) rounding it to starboard then to the finish line leaving the Peche Island Rear Range Light to port. The course length is 9.9NM

C COURSE – STARTING AREA LOCATION

The starting area will be in the vicinity of the Standard C Course. Approximate coordinates are 42° 21.5' N and 082° 52.3' W.

A/B and C COURSE - FINISH LINE

The finish line shall be between the water's edge of a buoy with an orange flag and a staff with an orange shape on the judges' stand at the Edison Boat Club.
